The academic success of students while at Trinity has proven that Trinity is the college preparatory leader in our region. The highest test scores in all

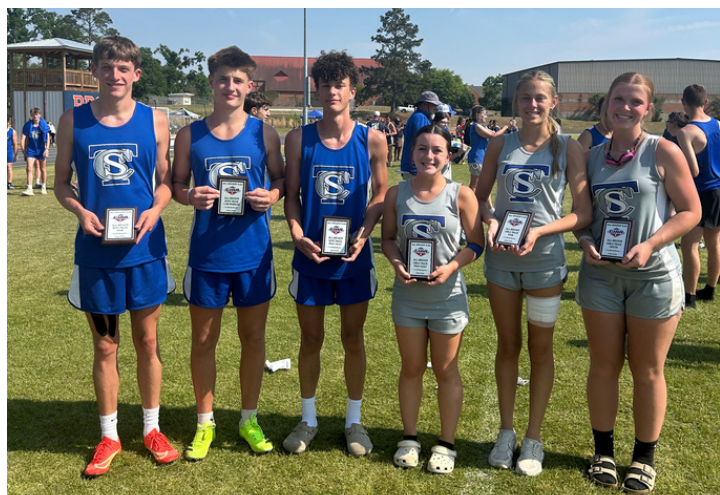

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

FISCAL MANAGEMENT

Trinity Christian School continues to operate within the framework of sound fiscal management principles. The fiscal year is June 1 – May 31. A preliminary budget is prepared under the direction of the Head of School in conjunction with the Board Treasurer and is approved by the Board of Directors. The financial office is overseen by the Head of School, Business Manager, and Finance Office Assistant. The budget is comprised of 10 categories with over 75 various cost centers and in excess of 300 detail line items to specifically track and record all income and expenses. Following each fiscal year, our financial records are submitted for review to the accounting firm of Symphona CPAs & Advisors. A copy of this report is provided to our Board of Directors. Additionally, accreditation standards require the school to be fully audited, at minimum, every five years. The last audit was completed for the 2024-25 fiscal year by the accounting firm of Symphona CPAs & Advisors in Dublin, GA.



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Symphona CPAs & Advisors have reviewed the accompanying statement of financial position of Trinity Christian School, Inc. as of May 31, 2026, and the related statements of activities, functional expenses, and cash flows for the year then ended. Based on our review, we are not aware of any material modifications that should be made to the accompanying financial statements in order for them to be in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Financial Aid

Continued good enrollment numbers at Trinity are attributed to several factors, one of which is a balanced Financial Aid program approved by our Board of Directors. This program has three specific areas: GOAL Scholarship, Tuition Assistance, Pastor Partnership. It is designed to help bridge the gap for families who demonstrate financial need and desire the environment our school provides.

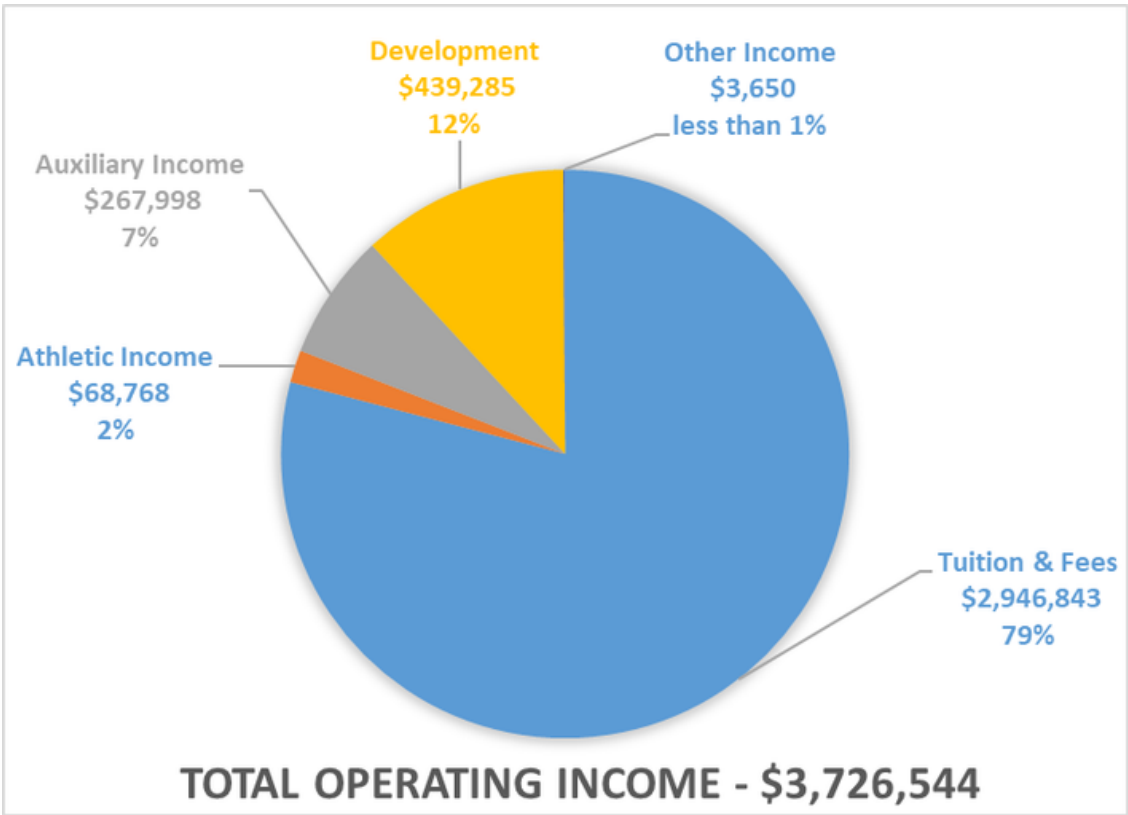
- 207 students from 132 families received Financial Aid through these programs during the 2025-26 year.
- The Financial Aid provided to families through these programs included the following:
 - * GOAL Scholarship \$461,465 (at no cost to Trinity as these Scholarships were funded by redirected tax dollars contributed to GOAL)
 - * Tuition Assistance \$74,984
 - * Pastor’s Partnership \$79,059
 - * Georgia Promise Scholarship \$57,057
- The revenue generated from 2025-26 Financial Aid was a total of \$1,648,470 (\$1,129,948 from families, \$461,465 from GOAL, and \$57,057 from Georgia Promise).



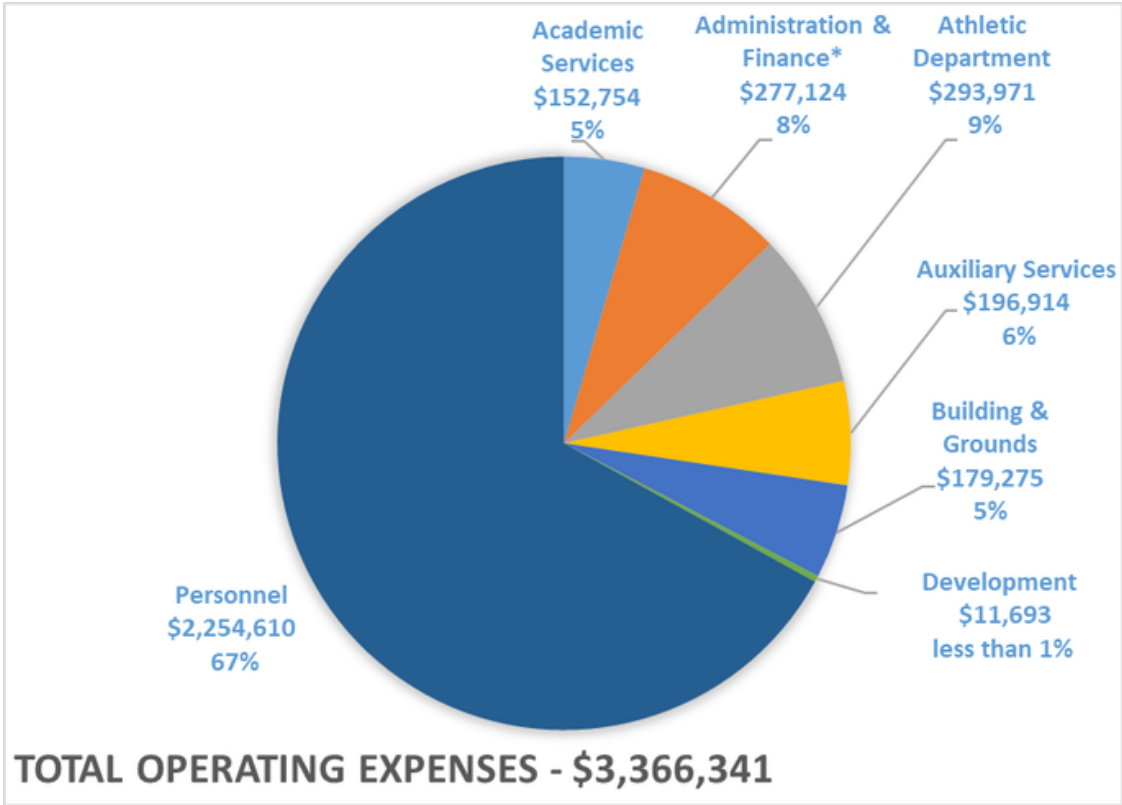
